


2. You are given the head of a linked list and a key. You have to delete the node that contains this given key.





4. Given a dictionary of words and an input string tell whether the input string can be completely segmented into dictionary words.




5. Given an array, find the contiguous subarray with the largest sum.




6. Given an input string, determine if it makes a valid number or not. For simplicity, assume that white spaces are not present in the input. https://www.freshersnow.com/

Google HR Interview Questions And Answers

1. Tell us about yourself

Your goal when you have asked for this question is to convey what you are and the interviewer has to know about your capabilities. While answering this question, make sure that you mentioned your educational qualification, strengths, projects, likes, dislikes, etc., However, by your answer to this question, the panel will come to know what you are capable of and will decide to fit you in the desired job role. https://www.freshersnow.com/

2. What are your short-term goals?

At that instant of time, anyone's goal is to get selected for the company. Let the panel know how much you want to get the job in their company. Also, you can mention your future with the company, saying that 'I would like to be truthful and faithful to this company by contributing as much as I can for its wellness. And I would like to see myself in a recognizable position.'

3. Do you have any plans for further education?

If you really have any plans for further education, then only you proceeded with this question. Either you can say like, 'For the wellness of the company if it needs anything more from me, I am ready to go for the further education. If it is not much required, I will continue to work in the organization.' Keep one thing in mind, you must be genuine and honest while answering this question.

4. Why did you choose this career?

Answer this question with the general sense stating that you have opted for this career for a purpose. The purpose of your choice must satisfy you and the people that live with you. You can convey the answer by stating that, 'As there is much demand for the technology, and for its making, I thought why shouldn't be a part of it. That is why I choose this field as my career.

5. What are your strengths?

You will be asked this question by the interview panel to know your capabilities in solving the problems. Showcase your strengths and let them know what actually you are. To make your explanation more simple, you can tell the recent experience, where you have used your strength to get into the situation.
