The leading nations of the world are making bombs which if another war came, would certainly be widely used. Nobody knows what the effect of dropping an atom bomb on a large scale would be, but it is quite possible that the total destruction of civilization of the west, and even parts of the world might ensue. Yet another great defect of civilization is that it does not know what to do with its knowledge. Science has given us powers

fit for Gods yet we use them like small children. For example, we do not know how to manage our machines. Machines were made to be man's servants: yet so dependent on them that they are in a fair way to become his masters.
