AIISH B.ASLP (entrance examination)

- 1. The exam shall be conducted on a single day in a single session.
- 2. The examination will be conducted in four subjects namely, Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics. All the students except those applying under the foreign quota, will have to write the entrance examination in 3 of the 4 subjects, i.e., *Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects and either Biology or Mathematics*, which is based on the CBSE syllabus of 11th and 12th standards.
- **3.** Entrance examination shall be a multiple choice questions and exam delivered on computer based platform (CBT).
- 4. The examination comprises of 150 Multiple Choices, single correct/best Response questions in English language only. Time allotted is 150 min. The question paper shall be divided into 3 parts: Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Mathematics each containing 50 marks.

- 6. Under no circumstances re-examination will be conducted for those who fail to appear for the entrance examination on the scheduled date and time.
- 7. A merit list will be prepared based on the total marks obtained from all the three subjects (Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Mathematics).
- 8. In the event of tie of total score
 - a. If there is a tie of total score between PCB & PCM candidates, then candidates who appeared for Biology paper of the entrance examination will get preference.
 - b. If there is a tie of total score between PCB candidates, then the relative position of the two candidates will be decided on the marks obtained in Biology followed by Physics and Chemistry.
 - c. If there is a tie of total score between PCM candidates, then the relative position of the two candidates will be decided on the marks obtained in Physics followed by Chemistry and mathematics.
 - d. In case of a tie even after the above conditions, then age of the candidate shall decide the ranking. Students who are older will be placed higher.

AIISH M.Sc (Audiology)/M.Sc. (Speech Language Pathology)

- There will be two separate entrance examinations for M.Sc (Audiology)/M.Sc. (Speech Language Pathology) courses. Candidates who wish to appear for both M.Sc. (Aud) / M.Sc. (SLP) entrance examination should apply separately for M.Sc. (Aud) / M.Sc. (SLP), respectively.
- 2. Both the exams shall be conducted on a single day.
- **3.** The syllabus shall comprise of subjects/knowledge assessed as per the B.ASLP course issued by Rehabilitation Council of India. Kindly refer to the RCI website http://www.rehabcouncil.nic.in/.org for complete document.
- 4. Entrance examination shall be a multiple choice questions exam delivered on computer based platform.
- 5. The examination comprises of 100 Multiple Choices, single correct/best Response questions in English language only. Time allotted is 100 min. The question paper shall be divided into 3 parts (Part A, B and C) each containing 20, 10 and 70 MCQs respectively. The distribution of MCQs in these parts shall be as per para 8.
- 6. There shall be 25% negative marking for incorrect answers. No marks will be deducted for unattempted questions.
