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INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CANDIDATES

1. Use only black/blue ink ball point pen to fill in the OMR sheet.
2. Write/mark your Roll Number (all eight digits) and Version as **C** on the left hand side of the OMR sheet (basic data part).
3. Fill in the OMR sheet carefully as per the instructions given on the back of the OMR sheet.
4. **The test consists of two Parts, viz. Objective Test and Descriptive Test. In the Objective Test there are 100 Objective Type multiple choice questions which are to be answered in 75 minutes. Descriptive Part is a test on English Language writing skill of 30 minutes duration for 40 marks.**
5. After opening the Question Booklet at 10.30 A.M., ensure that there are 100 Questions and that the printing of all the questions are legible. If there are any missing or illegibly printed questions, the matter may be reported to the Invigilator immediately.
6. There are 4 options (A, B, C & D) for each objective type question. Mark your answer corresponding to each question number by darkening the corresponding bubble on the OMR sheet with a ball point pen (black/blue ink). For every correct answer 1 mark will be awarded and for every incorrect answer 1/3 mark will be deducted from the total marks scored. Marking of more than one bubble against a question number on the OMR sheet shall be considered as incorrect answer. Erasing, overwriting, partial marking, etc. are not permitted.
7. Answers to the questions in the Descriptive Test have to be written on the sheets attached to the question paper itself. The Roll No. of the candidate should be written only in the column provided on the top of the question booklet and it should be attested by the Invigilator.
8. Candidates will not be allowed to use Calculator, Logarithm table, Mobile phone or any other electronic equipment in the examination hall.
9. The answer sheets should be returned to the Invigilator. The Candidate's Copy of the OMR Answer Sheet shall be obtained from the Invigilator before leaving the examination hall.
10. Answer keys of the Objective Test will be published in the websites www.lbskerala.com and www.lbscentre.org after the test. Complaints, if any, from the candidates regarding the answer keys with valid proof may be sent to the Deputy Director (EDP), LBS Centre for Science and Technology, so that it may reach his office within five calendar days from the date of publication of the answer keys. The envelope containing the complaint should be superscribed with '**HC-Complaints regarding answer keys**'. Complaints not substantiated with supporting documents will not be considered. However, the decision of the experts regarding such complaints on the answer keys shall be final.

If I were given carte blanche to write about any topic I could, it would be about how much our ignorance, in general, shapes our lives in ways we do not know about. Put simply, people tend to do what they know and fail to do that which they have no conception of. In that way, ignorance profoundly channels the course we take in life. And unknown unknowns constitute a grand swath of everybody's field of ignorance.

To me, unknown unknowns enter at two different levels. The first is at the level of risk and problem. Many tasks in life contain uncertainties that are known — so-called "known unknowns." These are potential problems for any venture, but they at least are problems that people can be vigilant about, prepare for, take insurance on, and often head off at the pass. Unknown unknown risks, on the other hand, are problems that people do not know they are vulnerable to.

Unknown unknowns also exist at the level of solutions. People often come up with answers to problems that are o.k., but are not the best solutions. The reason they don't come up with those solutions is that they are simply not aware of them. Stefan Fatsis, in his book "Word Freak," talks about this when comparing everyday Scrabble players to professional ones. As he says: "In a way, the living-room player is lucky . . . He has no idea how miserably he fails with almost every turn, how many possible words or optimal plays slip by unnoticed. The idea of Scrabble greatness doesn't exist for him."
