- (viii) Fees paid by **any other mode**, will NOT be accepted.
- (ix) Fees once paid, shall **NOT be Refunded** OR **shall NOT be Adjusted** in any subsequent Recruitment Process, under any circumstances.

- (iii) Preliminary Examination Paper (Objective Type) **shall be assessed / evaluated** by the Computer, as per entries made on **OMR Sheet**. As the evaluation is being done on the **Computer** by **Scanning**, there is no human intervention and hence, queries relating to **rechecking of the OMR Sheets**, subsequent to the Preliminary Examination, will not be entertained by the High Court. High Court reserves right to hold examination by any other mode also and if it so held, then also rechecking/reevaluation request will not be entertained by the High Court.
- (iv) In view of amended Rule-7, viz.
